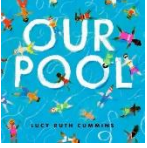
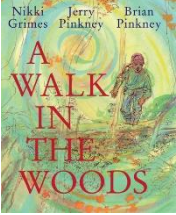


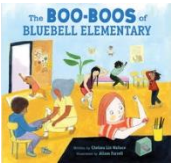
Miss Audrey's Picture Book Picks!

Michalak, Jaime and Sabine Timm: *Come on In: There's a Party in This Book!* Lemon and his friends are looking for a party...will you help him find one?



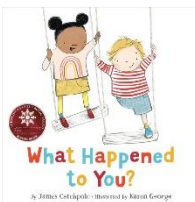

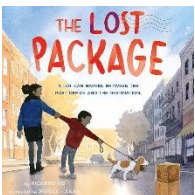

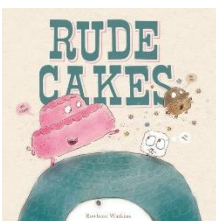
